



in State of Georgia Inclusive College Programs in the 2020– 21 Academic Year



Our Budget Ask for FY2022:



We are asking for an additional \$567,157 within the Georgia Council on Developmental Disabilities' IPSE FY22 funds, which would include the Governor's proposed reinstatement of the \$67,157 cut from last year's budget in addition to \$500,000. These funds will offset the financial impact seen by the IPSE programs and families as a result of GVRA's policy change.

- modify curricula to integrate universal design for learning across multiple disciplines
- ensure students are ready for real jobs upon graduation
